### General Provisions of the Organisation

#### Art.1

Our primary goal is the protection and observance of human rights and individual freedoms, with special consideration for Polish men and women, both within the country and abroad.

Our main activities include:

- a) Reporting cases of Polish rights violations to law enforcement agencies and international human rights organisations.
- b) Ensuring social oversight over the activities of public officials and institutions.
- c) Conducting educational initiatives aimed at Polish communities.

The main objectives of the Guardians of Polish & Christian Heritage are to promote good governance in all areas of the state and society, as well as to strive for a self-reliant community. To achieve these goals, the organisation seeks to raise awareness among citizens, activate them, encourage them to speak out, and organise actions aimed at ensuring the rule of law, human rights protection, equality, justice, transparency, and accountability at all levels of society. As a non-profit organisation dedicated to human rights protection and the fight for individual freedom, we operate wherever injustices against Poles are experienced, both domestically and internationally. The Guardians of Polish & Christian Heritage, registered with Companies House under number 15417549, is apolitical and non-profit, established to carry out public benefit tasks in selected specific areas:

§ 1. Protection of cultural heritage, including the Slavic and Christian values of the indigenous population of Poland, against racist hate speech or defamation.

§ 2. Combatting any restrictions on human rights, with particular emphasis on values such as the protection of life and health of individuals, as expressed in international instruments, especially the Nuremberg Code and the Geneva Conventions.

§ 3. Advocating for the sanctity of human life. Life as the supreme value according to the concept of humanism, which excludes any methods or doctrines that prioritize the apparent

good of the majority over an individual's God-given right to life and health, in accordance with their own will.

§ 4. Particularly, the fight against forms of modern slavery that may be hidden within fiscal programs, such as those based on false assumptions regarding climate change and other similar plans.

§ 5. Combating pejorative exegesis that relativizes the fundamental significance of concepts, especially morality, justice, deviations, pedophilia, and equality in the context of justice and social balance.

§ 6. Combating media and institutional terrorism aimed at genocidal and exterminatory actions against the indigenous population of Poland, including activities aimed at demoralizing and indoctrinating children.

§ 7. Combating the genocidal program of forced resettlement of populations drastically culturally and civilizationally different from the civilization of the indigenous population of Poland.

§ 8. Combating the unlawful deprivation of people's freedom without a valid court verdict, especially journalists and individuals expressing unfavorable opinions about the authorities, even when they are offensive, in the context of human rights violations by said authorities.

§ 9. Combatting an anti-democratic regime in Poland that brutally violates human rights, freedom of speech, press independence, and the expression of individuals acting in the public interest. Advocating for electoral rights, particularly the restoration of effective passive electoral rights, which are being questioned in Poland despite Poland's signing of the international agreement of the OSCE adopted by Poland on June 29, 1990, at the OSCE Conference on Human Dimension in Copenhagen, concerning human rights, in which Poland committed to ensuring, among other things, passive electoral rights.

§ 10. Collecting and gathering data, especially evidence and clues related to the above-mentioned issues.

## Art. 2

The organisation is founded on axiological values of national, social, religious, cultural, and familial significance, which serve the well-being and prosperity of every Pole and Christian. The organisation, in its actions, adheres to the principle of respecting the dignity, rights, and freedoms of every individual.

The organisation possesses legal personality.

The main headquarters of the organisation is located in the United Kingdom.

The organisation is established for an indefinite period.

The organisation operates worldwide, with a particular focus on the territory of the Republic of Poland and the United Kingdom.

## Art. 3

The organisation may confer honorary titles, establish orders, badges, medals, and other distinctions, and also award them along with other titles, awards, and honors to individuals,

legal entities, and unincorporated entities that have contributed to the ideals or goals set forth by the Organisation.

Art. 4

- 1) The organisation may establish local units, branches, facilities, representatives, subsidiaries, and other organisational entities, both within the country and abroad.
- 2) The organisation may become a member of national and international organisations with similar purposes.
- 3) The organisation may engage in commercial activities to raise funds for its statutory activities.

### **Statutory Goals of the Organisation**

- 1) The primary goal of the Organisation is to organise and provide assistance within the scope of public benefit activities.
- 2) The objectives of the Organisation arising from public benefit activities are as follows:
- 3) To assist and support individuals and legal entities when the public interest requires it, with a focus on the preservation, promotion, and protection of the cultural and social values of the Polish Nation and Christians, particularly the heritage and achievements of past generations.
- 4) To protect and aid the individual as a social entity, especially when their subjective rights are violated or there is a concern about their violation in the context of the infringement upon the heritage of Poles, including the violation of natural law or racist actions resulting in biased and pejorative treatment of individuals of Polish nationality and Christians.
- 5) To engage in activities aimed at maintaining, promoting, and protecting the cultural and social values of the Polish Nation, especially the heritage and achievements of past generations. To protect and assist the individual as a social entity, especially when their subjective rights are violated or there is a concern about their violation in the context of the infringement upon the heritage of Poles, including the violation of natural law or racist actions resulting in biased and pejorative treatment of individuals of Polish nationality.
- 6) Activities in support of veterans and repressed individuals.
- 7) To maintain and promote national traditions, nurture Polish identity, and develop national, civic, and cultural awareness.
- 8) To protect and promote health.

Art. 1

- 1) The implementation of the statutory goals of the Organisation involves organising and financing the following types of initiatives both within the country and abroad:
- 2) Assisting in the creation of territorial defense of the country by promoting patriotism among citizens and personal responsibility in various forms.
- 3) Providing assistance to individuals, particularly children, who have been harmed by individuals, state institutions, or fate.
- 4) Creating and disseminating national culture within the country and abroad, including among people with disabilities (publications, films, theater, and others).
- 5) Scientific initiatives by promoting the development of knowledge, including the provision of donations to research centers, research programs, and scholarship funds.

- 6) Educational initiatives by providing resources for the dissemination of education and health culture in society, preparing them for life in the context of European community and global social globalization.
- 7) Health protection by providing resources for healthcare centers, hospitals, rehabilitation facilities, and hospices to enable access to medical care and the purchase of medication.
- 8) Social assistance by providing resources to meet the essential health needs of individuals and families, as well as enabling them to live in conditions that respect human dignity and lead to the self-sufficiency of individuals and families at European standards.
- 9) Vocational and social rehabilitation of disabled persons by providing resources for the employment and rehabilitation of disabled individuals.
- 10) Environmental protection initiatives by providing resources for purposes arising from the Environmental Protection and Shaping Act.
- 11) Religious culture by providing resources to churches, religious associations, and legal entities of religious individuals.
- 12) Initiatives in the field of physical culture and sports by providing resources for improving and acquiring physical fitness, including donations to sports clubs, sports scholarships, support for sports events, including events for disabled individuals.

#### Art. 2

- 13) The beneficiaries of the Organisation are: individuals, legal entities, and unincorporated entities.<sup>[1]</sup>
- 14) In order to achieve its goals, the Organisation may support the activities of other legal entities and individuals whose activities align with the goals of the Organisation.

### **Types of Organisation Activities**

#### Art. 1

The Organisation conducts:

- 1) Statutory activities, and may also conduct
- 2) Economic activities to cover its statutory operations.

#### Art. 2

- 1) The statutory activities are defined by the provisions of the law and this Statute.
- 2) The Organisation is authorized to acquire and process personal data in accordance with the principles established by law.

#### Art. 3

- 1) Economic activities are subservient to the statutory activities, meaning that the income generated from economic activities is used to support the statutory activities.
- 2) The entire income from economic activities is allocated for the statutory activities of the Organisation.

## **Final Provisions**

Due to the registration of the non-profit Organisation in the United Kingdom, this statute and the activities of the Organisation are subject to the laws applicable in this country. The Organisation is registered with Companies House, which means that all legal matters, doubts, and interpretations of this statute will be resolved in accordance with the laws of the United Kingdom. The headquarters of the Organisation, located in the United Kingdom, further emphasizes our commitment to compliance with local legal regulations, both in the realm of non-profit activities and in other aspects of our Organisation's functioning.
